

More than 400 guests gathered at the Brooklyn Marriott on November 6 to celebrate Brooklyn As 35th Anniversary and to honor three outstanding individuals who are making a commitment to rebuilding and revitalizing New York City. Hosted and underwritten by Davis Polk & Wardwell, Pfizer and Independence Community Bank, the event raised \$255,000 for Brooklyn A, an unprecedented achievement for a community-based legal services organization.

he rain has kept few people away this evening. By 6:00 p.m., the room is filled with an incredible mix of leaders from New York City law firms, corporations, foundations and Brooklyn community organizations and residents. Guests have also come from as far away as Boston and Washington, D.C. to celebrate Brooklyn A's Partnership for Community & Economic Development and to pay tribute to this year's honorees.

Filmmaker Gertrude Houston, in collaboration with David Nolan of J.P. Morgan Chase & Co., have put together short films about the honorees and we get a personal glimpse of their childhoods and lives. After the film, each honoree speaks. Fred Hill, executive vice president of J.P. Morgan Chase & Co., shares his affection for Brooklyn A and his respect for the important work it is doing. Jim Gill, partner of Bryan Cave LLP, reminisces about his favorite team, the Brooklyn Dodgers, and compares their extraordinary qualities to those of the Brooklyn A team. And, Jeff Dunston, CEO of Northeast Brooklyn Housing Development Corp. speaks of the friends he's made at Brooklyn A in the course of working together to build affordable housing.

The evening continues with Veronica Martell and 20/20, a lively band that draws everyone to the dance floor, and even prompts a spontaneous break dancing exhibit by two of Jeff Dunston's sons. More surprises are in store when Jim Gill agrees to sign copies of his just-published autobiography, a copy of which is given to each guest through the generosity of an anonymous donor. New Grants Awarded



- \$150,000/yr. for two years from the Department of Justice to provide legal assistance to victims of domestic violence, in conjunction with the North Brooklyn Coalition Against Family Violence.
- \$100,000 from the Booth Ferris Foundation to support Brooklyn A's technology upgrade project.
- \$25,000/yr. for two years from Independence Community Foundation for eviction prevention work in Williamsburg and Greenpoint.
- \$40,000 from the New York Community Trust to hire a pro bono coordinator and implement a pro bono program.
