Summer Experience as an Intern

with Brooklyn A

THIS PAST SUMMER, I was a legal intern at Brooklyn A's Community and Economic Development (CED) Unit, in the East Brooklyn Office. The CED Unit

represents a variety of not-for-profit community groups in need of transactional legal support. One such client is a newly formed not-for-profit environmental organization in Canarsie. During my internship, I helped the

with Cleary winning 100% of all cases referred to them. In 2009 we referred the case of Jane B.* to Cleary. Jane B. was being treated for a long standing Bi-Polar Disorder that was clearly documented by her psychiatrist. The case was assigned to Liana Vitale who represented Jane B. before an Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) who at the time was still new to the bench. Unfortunately, an unfavorable decision was rendered by the judge and Liana Vitale, who had done a great job preparing for the hearing, was crushed by the decision. We immediately decided to appeal to the Appeals Council. In the mean time Jane B. was advised to reapply for SSI disability benefits.

The Appeals Council decided to deny Jane B's appeal while at the same time the Social Security Administration denied Jane B's second application for SSI. A decision

was made to appeal the Appeals Council's decision to Federal Court while also requesting a hearing on the SSI denial. The Federal Court appeal resulted in Jane B.'s case getting remanded for a new hearing. Meanwhile, Jane B.'s SSI denial was heard by another ALJ who determined that she was indeed disabled due to the Bi-Polar Disorder. Subsequently, the remanded hearing was held and Liana Vitale submitted evidence to show that Jane B's Bi-Polar disorder continued unchanged and that she was receiving SSI as a result of an ALJ decision that found that Jane B.'s Bi-Polar Disorder was disabling under Social Security's rules. This time a favorable decision was issued and Jane B. was awarded her retroactive SSI benefits. Liana Vital not only won Jane B.'s case but restored Cleary's perfect record. Congratulations to both Liana and Jane B.!
