

# Am I Experiencing Housing Discrimination?

Sometimes it can be hard to tell -  
here are a few examples

A section 8 voucher holder attempts to rent an apartment, but the landlord tells him that they don't accept Section 8 vouchers.

Advertisements for an apartment say, "No Children Allowed."

A female applicant for housing is told the that the deposit for an apartment is \$800. A male applicant is told the deposit is \$200.

A landlord makes repairs in the apartments of white tenants but refuses to make repairs in the apartments of Latino tenants.

This is a source of **income discrimination**. It is illegal to refuse someone housing based on their source of income.

This is a violation of fair housing laws because it **discriminates against families**.

This is **discrimination based on sex**. It is illegal for a landlord to set different terms for potential tenants based on sex or gender.

This is **discrimination based on race**. A landlord cannot provide different services to tenants of different races.

If you feel that you've been a victim of housing discrimination, report it!
