I heard that New York State issued a moratorium on evictions due to COVID-19. What does this mean?

Governor Andrew Cuomo placed a 90-day moratorium on evictions lasting until at least June 20, 2020; this means that a marshal is unable to evict anyone from their commercial spaces or homes. If your landlord sends you a notice saying you are behind on rent, we recommend that you seek legal assistance, even though the proceedings will be delayed.

- If you fall behind on rent, your landlord may be able to file a new case against you in court whenever courts start accepting new filings, including seeking to evict you or for the money you owe.
- Courts cannot issue an eviction warrant to remove your business from your space for now but will start accepting new filings once the moratorium is lifted.
- If you have received a document saying you need to appear in court or file a response in a certain number of days, you most likely do not need to appear on that date.
- If your landlord sends you a notice saying you are behind on rent, we recommend that you seek legal assistance, even though the proceedings will be delayed.

Do I still have to pay my rent even though the City says I have to close my business or seriously curtail my operations?

Currently, there is no suspension of rent payment at any level of government. You most likely are still legally obligated to pay rent. In general, a formally declared state of emergency, a government order to close your business, and/or an economic downturn do not excuse contractual obligations like those in your lease.

Small businesses throughout the City are facing severe issues paying their rent because of COVID-19, and landlords are aware of this. While you may still be legally required to pay your rent, you may be able to negotiate with your landlord to pay a reduced rent or no rent for a period.
